A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY OF ROCKFORD BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, ROCKFORD, TENNESSEE OPPOSING BLOUNT COUNTY'S PARTICIPATION IN THE EXPERIMENTAL PILOT PROGRAM AUTHORIZED BY TCA-2-3-301 ET SEQ ALLOWING THE ELIMINATION OF LOCAL PRECINCTS IN FAVOR OF REGIONAL VOTING CENTERS

WHEREAS, there is a proposal before the Blount County Commission to reduce the number of voting locations in Blount County from 31 to as few as 10; and

WHEREAS, there was no advance notice given to the City of Rockford by the Blount County Election Commission before this proposal was taken to the Blount County Commission; and

WHEREAS, this proposal has the potential to shut down voting at Rockford School at some point in the future; and

WHEREAS, by the letter of the proposed law only one polling place per county commission district is required; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission District 9 of which Rockford is a part stretches all the way to Seymour to the east; and

WHEREAS, it would be a tremendous burden for the voters of Rockford to have to travel 25 minutes to Seymour on election day; and

WHEREAS, it would be a tremendous burden for the voters of Seymour to have to travel to Rockford on election day; and

WHEREAS, voting is a fundamental right of all citizens of Blount County and the United States which should not be discouraged or suppressed in any way; and

WHEREAS, the proposal before the Blount County Commission would someday have the effect of suppressing and discouraging voting on Election Day; and

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Rockford City Commission opposes the proposal to reduce the number of voting locations in Blount County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Rockford City Commission requests its District 9 Commissioners to vote against this proposal: and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Rockford City Commission requests that all Blount County Commissioners vote against the aforementioned proposal; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Rockford City Commission urges the Blount County legislative delegation to Nashville to oppose this measure if it ever reaches the Tennessee State Legislature.
